

How do we fund The Pump House Project?




SOME FACTS

It costs approximately £17,000 p.a. to run the project. We currently receive around £3,500 p.a. in revenue from our User Groups and Hall Hire, and in 2016 we received £6,000 in donations and ring fenced grants amounted to £3,200. Plans are in hand to maintain, hopefully increase this level of funding in 2017. This however, leaves a shortfall of around £4,300 just to stand still.

Clearly more funding is essential if we are going to survive and grow, and this is raised in numerous ways. The regular Wednesday cake café, our bi-monthly disco, children's clothes sale, afternoon tea & music, the 200 club lottery and 'Friends of TPHP' initiatives are just some. 'The Place' run by Faringdon Town Council will be another valuable source of income for 2017.

Our thanks to our user groups and to everyone who have and who are supporting us financially and with your free time.




