The Queens Award for Voluntary Service



Royal Garden Party 16th May 2017



On 28th April 2017, an email addressed to Lou Smith of The Pump House Project was received, informing that TPHP had been nominated for The Queens Award for Voluntary Service 2017. It contained an invitation to attend a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace. Lou was able to bring along one other guest and an adult child.

It was unanimously agreed by all Trustees that Lou should be accompanied by her mother, Doris (Dottie) Robinson, the longest serving volunteer, therefore representing TPHP Volunteers, and Lou's daughter Ella Goodwin, (Lets Dance & Peppa Pig) representing our Users groups.



Lou's story

There are very few days you can remember really clearly, however, being invited to a Buckingham Palace Garden Party with the Queen has to be one of them. My invitation arrived and I was allowed to take one guest and one of my grown up children with me. My guest was my Mum who had just celebrated her 90th birthday 3 days earlier and could not believe that she was going to have tea with the Queen.



We only had a few days to prepare for this special afternoon, posh frocks and hats to be bought, a lot of laughter trying on ever more ridiculous hats, but very exciting to get this unexpected invite. On the day we took a coach from Oxford to London and had just enough time for some lunch in a café near Buckingham Palace, and had a wonderful time watching all the other guests stroll past on their way to the Palace entrances. Military uniforms, smart suits, top hats and floral dress and of course lots of crazy hats!!

The gates opened at 3.00pm and after showing our invitation to one of the smartly dressed guardsmen, suddenly we were part of the party! The weather was perfect for the 3 hours we spent at the garden party, there were two military bands playing and even though there were around 8000 guests attending, it was so well organised with garden tables and chairs to sit at or you could just stroll around the lawns and paths. We walked up the steps of the Palace and stood on the patio area for some time, taking in where we were!



Just before 4.00pm we (the guests) were asked to line up on the lawn, the Yeoman of the Guard made it very clear where you have to stand!! Everyone was keeping an eye on a door to the left of the steps leading down to the garden and as the door opened we got to see the Queen, Prince Phillip, Prince William and Kate and a dozen other dignitaries.



The band played 'God Save The Queen' and then we were lucky enough to be only a few feet away from the Queen and Prince Phillip as they made their way along the crowd. We were so lucky to have been standing so near and my daughter actually had the Queen look straight at her, she was over the moon!!

Next we had tea and cakes and cucumber and mint sandwiches, sitting in the afternoon sun, it was perfect. We met several old friends which was really unexpected, the best one was for my Mum, who spent some time with an old family friend who is the Queen's official cameraman, we had no idea he would be there, now that was a special moment for them both!

At 5.45pm the Royal party left the garden and we spent some time taking more photos and listening to the band, we then walked up the garden steps into the Palace itself, along with the other guests. We came out of the Palace through the Grand Entrance! The tourists outside the gates were intrigued to see so many very happy people pouring out of the Palace to get our buses or cabs back to our own palaces!!!!

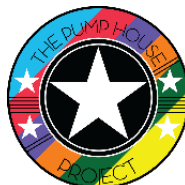


'Every Teddy Bear who's been good, is sure of a treat today, there's lots of marvellous things to eat, and wonderful games to play.'

AT THE PUMP HOUSE PROJECT ON SATURDAY 1ST APRIL

“It's the best, un-discovered venue in Faringdon”

Ever since the Crown Hotel re-decorated and set up their upstairs gourmet dining area, we have struggled to find a local venue that can accommodate Boogie Me. The Corn Exchange sound limiters are set so low that a single trumpet with no amplification cuts off the power,



the junior school is, well a school hall, and the Bell Hotel becomes a very intimate venue with us all crammed in.

There's always the Bell beer garden, and Follyfest stage which we love to play, but they only work at the right time of the year. When someone suggested The Pump House Project, I imagined a dark village hall, tiny stage and a couple of

cheap stage lights, which would just about accommodate the band and a few more ... because nobody talks about it as a music venue. We were delighted to find our expectations completely shattered.

The stage is huge, and comfortably accommodated us, grand piano included with room to spare. it's a little high up, but that doesn't seem to impact on the 'jazz club' feel that the venue has when it is full of dancing couples under dim light (which makes us all better looking!)

Thanks to the good people of Faringdon, and particularly those next door to the venue (whom we understand were mostly there) we managed to sell out our tickets, and raise £680 for Ovarian Cancer, and The Pump House Project.

From our perspective, it's the best un-discovered venue in Faringdon. We know that we can't use it for music too frequently, lest we abuse the goodwill of its neighbours. We would love and hope that we can continue to play there occasionally.

Jon Lane : Founder of Boogie Me

Boogie Me are a 15 piece Rhythm, Blues and Boogie band based in Faringdon. Formed in 2005 by Jon Lane, the band comprises experienced players who have cut their teeth with numerous bands and orchestras. Drawn together with a collective love of R&B, Soul, Blues and obviously, Boogie, the band continues to grow from strength to strength. With a set list that includes songs recorded by Ray Charles, Solomon Burke, Aretha Franklin, Stevie Wonder, Paulo Nutini, Amy Winehouse, Nina Simone, Sam Brown, The Commitments, Blues Brothers, James Brown, Jools Holland and others, there really is something for everyone.

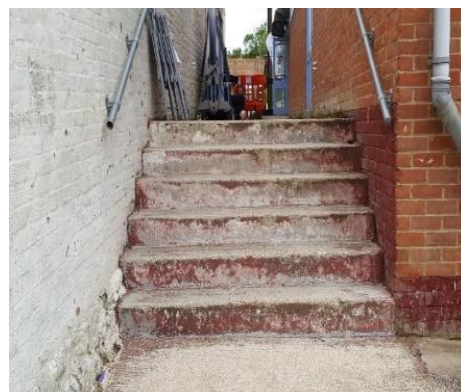

Disabled access at The Pump House Project



Tesco's exciting local community grant scheme, where the money raised from the 5p bag charge is being used to fund thousands of local projects in communities right across the UK. Projects that bring benefit to their community will get the green light – these range from improving community buildings and outdoor spaces to buying new equipment, training coaches or volunteers and hosting community events.



THE PUMP HOUSE DISABLED ACCESS, is one of three projects in our district that will be put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores during May and June, where Tesco customers will decide by voting each time they shop. This photograph shows the very steep and awkward steps at rear of TPHP and where the disabled access will be built if successful.



Faringdon Town Council applied for this grant, and the winner will be the project with the highest number of customer votes, and will receive up to £4,000. This will be announced during July 2017. ***So, please when shopping in Tesco's, don't forget to support this very important project.***



Side shelter at The Pump House Project

At the time this Newsletter is going to press, the long awaited purpose built shelter is being constructed, using timber and polycarbonate roofing panels, it will run from the Swan Lane entrance, down to the rear garden steps (see above). This shelter will be multifunctional and used by many for a range of events. Keeping prams and pushchairs safe and dry is the main objective, but also a possible smoking area, a BBQ area, a bar area, plus many more uses.

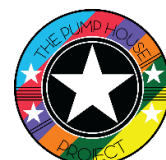


New stage flooring at The Pump House Project

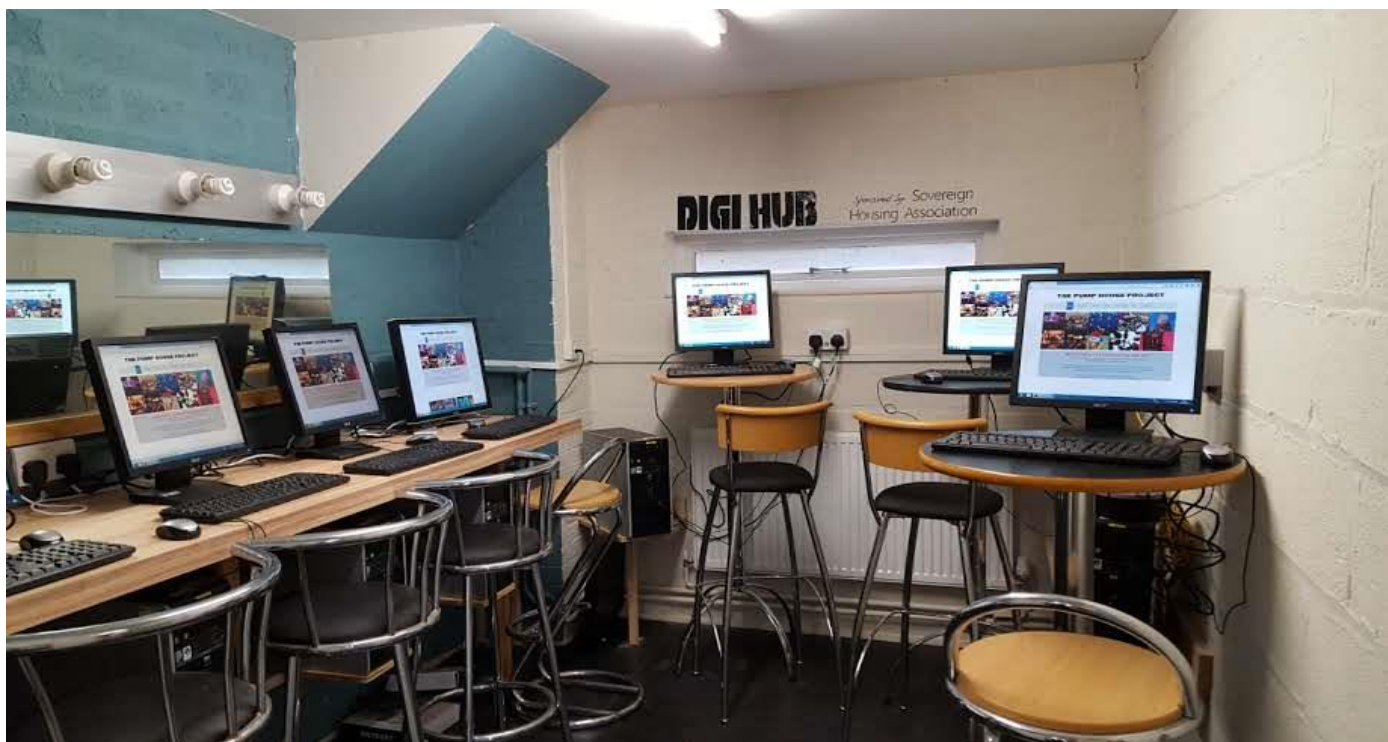
